



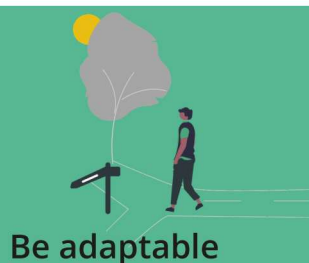
Shareholder Membership

What are the benefits of being a shareholder?

- Attend the Annual General Meeting (AGM), usually held each September, where you can:
- Receive the Society's annual accounts
- Hear from the Chair about Albyn's performance and achievements over the past year
- Receive the auditor's report
- Vote on the election of Board Members
- Approve the appointment of external auditors
- Attend Special General Meetings (SGMs) when required
- Stand for election to the Board, helping shape the future direction of the Society
- Nominate other Members for election to the Board

How to become a member?

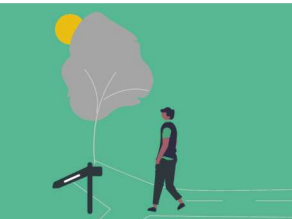
Becoming a member is simple and open to individuals aged 16 and over who support Albyn's purpose and values and want to play a positive role in shaping strong communities.

Complete a membership form - the form can be found in this pack, online or ask a member of the team for support.

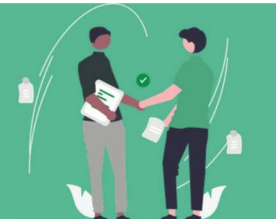
Pay a £1 membership fee (this gives you one share in the Society).

Your application will be considered and approved by the Board.

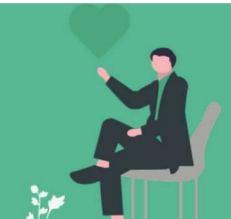
Once approved, you will be added to the Register of Members and can begin taking part in helping us shape the future!
